Class hours: 2 theory classes per week and 2 practical classes per week. Total 4 classes per week.

Duration of the Examinations: 1.5 hrs, Theoretical and 2 hrs. Practical Examinations.

Paper Objectives

Knowledge Acquired:

- 1. To gain a deep understanding of the factors that shape personality, including physical, social, psychological, and philosophical influences.
- 2. Acquire insights into self-awareness, self-defense strategies, mindset transformation, leadership traits, attitudes such as assertiveness and negotiation, time management and stress management.
- 3. The knowledge of the importance of teamwork, influencing skills, sociability, and ethical values.

Skills Gained:

- 1. Develop a range of practical skills, including map reading and navigation techniques, understanding topographical forms and grid systems, the ability to determine cardinal points and find north.

Class hours: 2 theory classes per week and 2 practical classes per week. Total 4 classes per week.

Duration of the Examinations: 1.5 hrs. Theoretical and 2 hrs. Practical Examinations.

Paper Objectives

Knowledge Acquired:

1. Acquire knowledge about the definition, classification, and effects of disasters.

- 2. Gain an understanding of the National Disaster Management Authority of India, its organizational structure, and role in disaster response. Additionally, participants learn about the role of NDRF (National Disaster Response Force)
- 3. Knowledge about the role of NCC (National Cadet Corps) cadets in maintaining essential services during disasters, and methods of providing NCC assistance.
- 4. Gain knowledge about civil defense services and their duties in disaster management.
- 5. Basic Knowledge about Weapons and their characteristics
- 6. Basic knowledge to motivate the youth for Social Services and Community Development.

Skills Gained:

- 1. Practical skills in disaster preparedness and response, including the ability to assess and classify disasters.
- 2. Skills related to providing assistance during natural disasters, such as first aid, camp hygiene, and employment of NCC cadets.
- 3. Acquire knowledge and skills in social services, rural development, and community engagement.

- 1. Competency in disaster management and response, enabling them to contribute effectively during crisis situations.
